*You can deduct your membership dues

*You can deduct your donations for raffles for tabletop (cash or item donated)

*You can deduct items ussed for your tabletop display as long as it is not used for your personal gain

*You can deduct items donated for our Community Affairs care arrangements

Be sure to keep good records and copies of receipts for your CPA and your files. (Be sure to check with your CPA if you have any questions. These could be subject to interpretation by your CPA and will depend on your filing status as to whether they qualify to be deducted. Either way, it is always a good idea to keep track of expenses.)
